**G**lenn Burdette Chapel of The Villages Florida passed away September 5th, 2018 after a brief stay at Ocala Regional Medical Center. Born May 19th, 1932 in Warren, PA where he and his wife Beverly of 66 years resided until moving to The Villages in 2007. Glenn was a crane operator at National Forge Steel for the 36 years and retired in 1991.

Glenn was a Korean War veteran and was pleased to have been chosen for the first Korean War Honor flight from the Villages. He was an avid golfer and was very proud of his "Hole in One" Certificate. His great joy in life was spending time with his children, grandchildren and great grandchildren.
